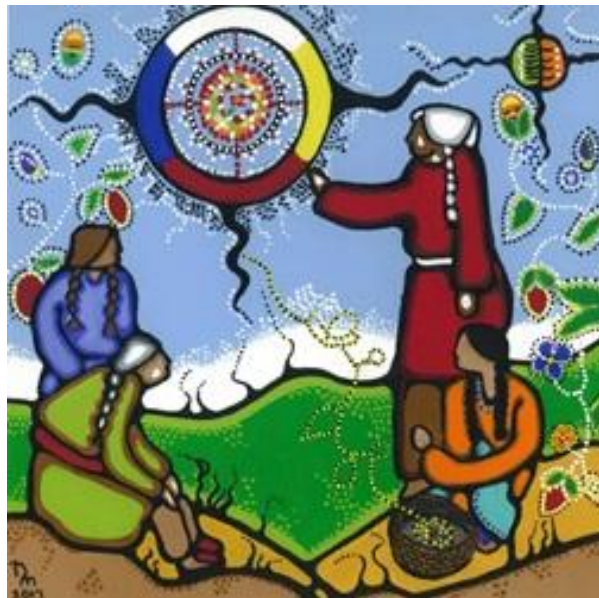

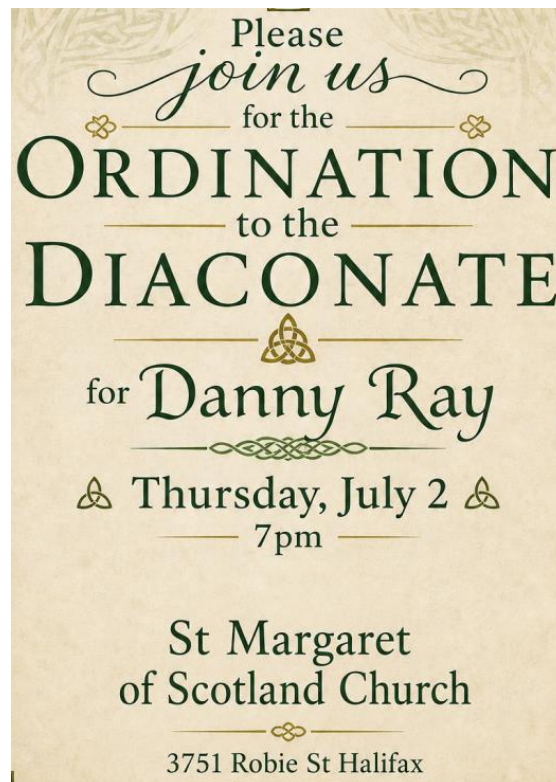
The next Monthly Casserole Lunch is October 1 at 11:30 am

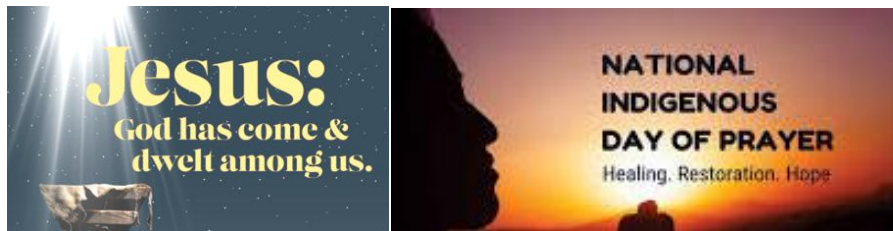
